1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §723-A, sub-§5-C is enacted to read:
3 4 5 6 7	5-C. Opt-out for party primaries. A political party may opt out from the provisions of this section for the party's primary election and cause the primary election to be determined by a plurality of votes cast in that election if the party's convention under section 321 votes to opt out of applying a ranked-choice voting count for the party's primary election and that determination is incorporated into the party's rules.
8	SUMMARY
9 10 11	This bill allows a political party to opt out of ranked-choice voting for the party's primary election if the determination to opt out is made by a vote of the party's convention and incorporated into the party's rules.
