COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 18, L.D. 6, "An Act to Allow Persons to Label Their Wild Animal Traps with Their Online Identification Number Issued by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife"

Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 1 in the last 2 lines (page 1, lines 5 and 6 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "hunting, fishing and"

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

**SUMMARY**

This amendment amends the bill by removing language that permitted labeling a trap with a hunting or fishing online licensing system identification number issued by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. This change is necessary because there is no situation when a person would use a hunting or fishing license to trap in Maine.
