2	Sec. 1. 4 MRSA c. 2 is enacted to read:
3	CHAPTER 2
4	GENERAL PROVISIONS
5	§71. Term start date for judicial officers
6 7 8	The term of appointment of a judicial officer appointed pursuant to the Constitution of Maine, Article V, Part First, Section 8 begins on the date that the judicial officer is sworn into office.
9	§72. Inapplicability of Title 5, section 6 qualification requirements
10 11	The provisions of Title 5, section 6 do not apply to judicial officers appointed pursuant to the Constitution of Maine, Article V, Part First, Section 8.
12	SUMMARY
13 14 15 16	This bill clarifies that the term of appointment of a judicial officer appointed pursuant to the Constitution of Maine begins on the date of swearing in and that the qualification requirements of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 6 do not apply to such a judicial officer.
