HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 105,
L.D. 172, "An Act to Require the Maine State Police to Create a Statewide List of Missing
Persons"

Amend the amendment in section 2 in subsection 9 in the last line (page 2, line 10 in
amendment) by striking out the following: "and"


Amend the amendment in section 2 in subsection 10 in the first line (page 2, line 11 in
amendment) by striking out the following: "person." and inserting the following: 'person;
and'

Amend the amendment in section 2 by inserting after subsection 10 the following:
'11. A representative from each of the federally recognized Indian tribes, nations or
bands in the State, appointed by the representative's respective tribe, nation or band.'

Amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or
section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

This amendment adds a representative from each of the federally recognized Indian
tribes, nations or bands in the State to the working group to review best practices for
investigating missing persons cases in the State.
