The amendment provides that, beginning January 1, 2026, the fee for boats operating on inland waters of the State with a motor that is 5 horsepower or less is \$20, \$10 of which must be used for invasive species prevention and control. The amendment provides that the fee for boats operating only on tidal waters with a motor that is 5 horsepower or less is \$10. The amendment also provides that the fee for operating a watercraft with a motor that has a horsepower rating over 5 horsepower but no more than 10 horsepower is the same as the fee currently established for watercraft with a motor that is 10 horsepower or less. Fiscal Detail and Notes

The fee changes proposed in this bill are expected to reduce General Fund revenue to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife (IFW) and the Department of Marine Resources (DMR), as well as reduce Other Special Revenue Funds (OSR) revenue to both IFW and the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP). Detailed impacts are outlined below:

The estimated revenue reductions are based on current registration data and assume that approximately 11,913 inland and 2,269 tidal registrations that are currently registered as 10 hp or below would qualify under the 5 hp or below category created in the bill. Statutorily required fee increases in fiscal year 2028-29 and distribution formulas for the Lake and River Protection Sticker program remain unchanged. The bill includes accompanying Other Special Rever-Fund deallocations to reflect the reduction in anticipated revenues.
