An Act to Provide Legislative Oversight of the Rule-making Petition Process

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- **Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §8055, sub-§3,** as amended by PL 1985, c. 506, Pt. A, §4, is further amended to read:
- 3. Receipt of petition. Within 60 days after receipt of a petition, the agency shall either notify the petitioner in writing of its denial, stating the reasons therefor, or initiate appropriate rule-making proceedings. Whenever a petition to adopt or modify a rule is submitted by 150 or more registered voters of the State, the agency shall initiate appropriate rule-making proceedings within 60 days after receipt of the petition. The petition must be verified and certified in the same manner provided in Title 21-A, section 354, subsection 7, prior to its presentation to the agency. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, a rule-making proceeding initiated under this section by an agency based on a petition to adopt or modify a rule submitted by 150 or more registered voters of the State must be conducted by the agency through major substantive rulemaking in accordance with the requirements of subchapter 2-A.

15 SUMMARY

This bill amends the law governing petition-based rulemaking by an agency to provide that a rule-making proceeding initiated by an agency based on a petition to adopt or modify a rule submitted by 150 or more registered voters of the State must be conducted by the agency through major substantive rulemaking in accordance with the requirements of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.
