Transitional housing pilot programs. Resolved: That the Department 17 of Corrections shall contract with a community-based organization to establish a 18 transitional housing pilot program to provide transitional living services for individuals 19 recently released from correctional facilities, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, 20 Title 34-A, section 1001, subsection 6, which must include, but not be limited to, temporary 21 housing or providing a master leasing program that assists individuals with rent support, 22 life skills coaching and other services. The department shall also establish a transitional 23 housing pilot program in southern Maine for adult clients recently released from 24 correctional facilities. 25 No later than January 1, 2026, the department shall submit an interim report to the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety providing data on its progress 26 27 in establishing the transitional housing pilot programs and data regarding use of the 28 programs by individuals recently released from correctional facilities. No later than 29 January 1, 2027, the department shall submit a final report to the joint standing committee 30 of the Legislature having jurisdiction over criminal justice and public safety matters 31 providing updated data from the interim report as well as data regarding the rates of return 32 to department custody for individuals who have participated in the programs. 33 committee may submit legislation based on the report to the 133rd Legislature in 2027. 34 Appropriations and allocations. This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, replaces the bill with a resolve and provides one-time funding to the Department of Corrections to establish 2 pilot programs for individuals recently released from correctional facilities. The Department of Corrections is required to contract with a community-based organization to establish a transitional housing pilot program to provide transitional living services for individuals recently released from Department of Corrections correctional facilities, which must include, but not be limited to, temporary housing or providing a master leasing program that assists individuals with rent support, life skills coaching and other services. The department is required to establish a transitional housing pilot program in southern Maine for adult clients. The Department of Corrections is required to submit an interim report no later than January 1, 2026 and a final report no later than January 1, 2027 to the
