3 4	Amend the resolve in section 5 in subsection 2 in paragraph D in the last line (page 2, line 28 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "and"
5 6	Amend the resolve in section 5 in subsection 3 in the last line (page 2, line 34 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "State." and inserting the following: 'State;"
7	Amend the resolve in section 5 by inserting after subsection 3 the following:

15 16	This amendment makes the following changes to the Commission to Recommend Methods for Preventing Deed Fraud in the State membership:

18 19	It adds one individual who represents civil legal aid providers for residents of this State who are elderly;
20	3. It adds one individual who represents banking institutions in the State;
21 22	 It clarifies that the individual who represents law enforcement interests represents the Department of Public Safety, Maine State Police computer crimes unit; and
23 24	 It removes one individual who represents a statewide association representing criminal defense attorneys.
25	The amendment also adds the following duties to require the commission to:
26 27	1. Examine ways to mitigate the fraudulent listing of homes for rent by individuals who are not the legal homeowners; and
28 29	Examine ways in which deed fraud is being conducted through the Internet, including the use of artificial intelligence technology.

Legislative Cost/Study

The general operating expenses of this study are projected to be \$3,050 in fiscal year 2025-26. The Legislature's proposed budget for the 2026-2027 biennium includes \$22,196 in each of fiscal years 2025-26 and 2026-27 for the costs of legislative studies, as well as \$8,265 in projected balances from fiscal year 2024-25 and \$33,073 of balances carried over from prior years for this purpose. Whether these amounts are sufficient to fund all studies will depend on the number of studies authorized by the Legislative Council and the Legislature. The additional costs of providing staffing assistance to the study during the interim can be absorbed utilizing existing budgeted staff resources.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

Additional costs to the Departments of Public Safety, the Real Estate Commission and the Secretary of State associated with serving on the commission are expected to be minor and can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
