1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §2915-A is enacted to read:
3 4	§2915-A. Sale or provision of self-administered sexual assault forensic evidence collection kit prohibited
5 6	1. Definitions. As used in this section, the following terms have the following meanings.
7 8	A. "Covered evidence kit" means a self-administered sexual assault forensic evidence collection kit to collect evidence relating to an alleged sexual assault.
9	B. "Person" has the same meaning as in Title 5, section 206, subsection 2.
10	C. "Sexual assault" has the same meaning as in section 2915, subsection 3-A.
11 12	2. Prohibition. A person may not sell, offer for sale or otherwise provide a covered evidence kit to an individual.
13 14	3. Admissibility. This section does not apply to the admissibility of a covered evidence kit as evidence in a court proceeding.
15 16	4. Violation. A violation of this section is a violation of the Maine Unfair Trade Practices Act.
17	SUMMARY
18 19 20	This bill prohibits and makes a violation of the Maine Unfair Trade Practices Act the sale, offering for sale or otherwise providing to an individual a self-administered sexual assault forensic evidence collection kit. This bill does not apply to the admissibility of a
21 22	self-administered sexual assault forensic evidence collection kit as evidence in a court proceeding.
