16 17 18 19	This bill repeals provisions in the Maine Criminal Code that authorize the court to suspend a person's driver's license, permit, privilege to operate a motor vehicle or right to apply for or obtain a license for a period not to exceed 5 years if the person uses a motor vehicle to facilitate:
20	1. The trafficking of a scheduled drug;
21	2. The trafficking or furnishing of a counterfeit drug;
22	3. The aggravated trafficking in a scheduled drug;
23	4. The aggravated trafficking in or furnishing of a counterfeit drug;
24	5. The aggravated furnishing of a scheduled drug;
25	6. The aggravated cultivating of marijuana;
26	7. The unlawful furnishing of a scheduled drug; or
