COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 293, L.D. 439, "An Act to Preserve  
Maine's Sporting Heritage and Enhance Sporting Opportunities for Maine's Youth by  
Allowing Maine's Youth to Hunt on Sunday"

Amend the bill in section 3 in subsection 1-A in the 2nd line (page 1, line 25 in L.D.)  
by inserting after the following: "age" the following: 'or younger'

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section  
number to read consecutively.

**SUMMARY**

This amendment clarifies language in the bill to ensure that a person who is under 18  
years of age is eligible to hunt on Sundays if the person is enrolled in secondary school and  
holds a valid hunting license.
