2	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3174-PPP is enacted to read:
3	§3174-PPP. Reimbursement for certain weight loss medications
4 5 6 7 8 9	The department shall provide reimbursement under the MaineCare program for glucagon-like peptide-1 receptor agonists that are approved by the federal Food and Drug Administration for the treatment of obesity. The department shall restrict reimbursement under the MaineCare program of glucagon-like peptide-1 receptor agonists to medications prescribed by a primary care provider or a bariatric specialist and shall require a prior authorization of the medication.
