Amend the bill in section 6 in §1025 in the first indented paragraph in the 3rd line (page 4, line 25 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "as required by Title 15, section 1092, paragraph 4"

17 Amend the bill by inserting after section 16 the following:

18 'Sec. 17. Working group; report. The Administrative Office of the Courts shall 19 convene a working group with representatives that are currently employed as bail 20 commissioners to examine the establishment of bail officers, whether bail officers have 21 improved administration of the bail code and whether any further changes to state law are 22 necessary in relation to the establishment of bail officers. The Administrative Office of the 23 Courts shall submit a report containing the findings and recommendations of the working 24 group to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over criminal 25 justice and public safety matters by November 4, 2026. The committee may report out 26 legislation based on the report during the 133rd Legislature in 2027.

SUMMARY

8 This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, amends the bill by 9 retaining a bail commissioner's authority to take the personal recognizance of any 10 defendant for appearance on a charge of a Class D crime as authorized by current law and 11 makes a technical change. The amendment requires that the Administrative Office of the 12 Courts convene a working group with members that are employed as bail commissioners 13 to examine the establishment of bail officers. The Administrative Office of the Courts shall 14 submit a report based on the findings of the working group to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over criminal justice and public safety matters by 15 16 November 4, 2026. The committee may submit legislation based on the report to the 133rd 17 Legislature in 2027. The amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section. FISCAL NOTE REQUIRED 18

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill includes ongoing General Fund appropriation to the Judicial Branch of \$400,377 in fiscal year 2025-26 and \$409,398 in fiscal year 2026-27 to establish 3 bail officer positions to set and execute bail in accordance with the law.
