14 15 16	'Sec. 1. Commissioner of Health and Human Services to convene working group. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Health and Human Services shall convene a working group to study assaults on health care workers in health care facilities.
17 18	Sec. 2. Membership. Resolved: That the working group convened under section 1 must include, but is not limited to, the following members:
19	1. The Commissioner of Health and Human Services or the commissioner's designee;
20	2. A representative of a statewide association representing hospitals;
21 22	3. A representative of a statewide organization representing entities that provide long-term care services;
23 24	4. A representative of a statewide organization representing entities that provide outpatient care services;
25 26	5. A representative of a statewide organization representing entities that provide mental health services;
27	6. A representative of a statewide association representing prosecutors;
28	7. A representative of a statewide association representing criminal defense lawyers;

The Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety may report out legislation based on the report to the Second Regular Session of the 132nd Legislature.'

16	SUMMARY
17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24	This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, replaces the bill with a resolve. The amendment directs the Commissioner of Health and Human Services to convene a working group to study assaults on health care workers in health care facilities. The commissioner is required to submit a report by January 1, 2026 to the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety and the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services. The Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety may report out legislation based on the report to the Second Regular Session of the 132nd Legislature.
