COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 240, L.D. 561, "An Act to Ensure Subsidy Reimbursements for Certain Child Care Providers"

Amend the bill by striking out all of section 1 and inserting the following:

'Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3737, sub-§6 is enacted to read:

6. Reimbursement for subsidies. The department shall reimburse a provider of child care services provided under this chapter for subsidy payments under the Maine Child Care Affordability Program in section 3731-A administered by the department pursuant to rules adopted by the department. Reimbursement under the program to a child care provider must be based on enrollment rather than attendance and may not be reduced or eliminated based on a child's attendance. The department shall adopt rules to implement this subsection. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.

Sec. 2. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and allocations are made.

Initiative: Provides funding to reimburse child care providers for subsidy payments based on enrollment rather than attendance under the Maine Child Care Affordability Program for children whose subsidy payments are not covered by federal grant funding.

This amendment removes all the provisions of the bill regarding reimbursement based on generally accepted payment practices. The amendment retains the provisions of the bill that relate to payments based on enrollment rather than attendance. The amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section.
