## An Act to Make Agricultural Workers and Other Related Workers Employees Under the Wage and Hour Laws

Notwithstanding any provision of subsection 3 to the contrary, an employer may not require an individual employed in agriculture as defined in the Employment Security Law and the Federal Unemployment Tax Act or an individual employed in certain activities related to agriculture to work more than 40 hours in any one week unless the hourly rate specified in this subsection is paid for all hours actually worked in excess of 40 hours in that week. The regular hourly rate includes all earnings, bonuses, commissions and other compensation that is paid or due based on actual work performed and does not include any sums excluded from the definition of "regular rate" under the federal Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938, 29 United States Code, Section 207(e).</li> <li>A. Beginning January 1, 2026, an individual employed in agriculture or an individual employed in certain activities related to agriculture may not be required by an employer to work more than 40 hours in any one week unless 1 1/2 times the regular hourly rate is paid for all hours actually worked in excess of 50 hours in that week. This paragraph is repealed January 1, 2027.</li> </ul>

Beginning January 1, 2027, an individual employed in agriculture or an individual employed in certain activities related to agriculture may not be required by an employer to work more than 40 hours in any one week unless 1 1/2 times the regular hourly rate is paid for all hours actually worked in excess of 45 hours in that week.

Beginning January 1, 2028, an individual employed in agriculture or an individual employed in certain activities related to agriculture may not be required by an employer to work more than 40 hours in any one week unless 1 1/2 times the regular hourly rate is paid for all hours actually worked in excess of 40 hours in that week.
36 37 38 39	For the purposes of this subsection, "certain activities related to agriculture" means the canning; processing; preserving; freezing; drying; marketing; storing; packing for shipment; or distributing of agricultural produce; meat and fish products; and perishable foods.
40	Sec. 6. Effective date. This Act takes effect January 1, 2026.

1	SUMMARY
2	This bill provides that agricultural employees and seasonal farm employees are subject
3	to the laws that place limits on mandatory overtime. It also provides that agricultural
4	employees are subject to the laws that set a minimum wage and overtime rate. It provides
5	that the laws that set an overtime rate apply to certain activities related to agricultural
6	produce, meat and fish products and perishable foods. The bill phases in overtime pay for
7	individuals employed in agriculture and certain activities related to agriculture.
