2	Auditor shall audit all state agencies and compile a report that lists for each state agency:
3	1. The number of current employees;
4	2. The number of newly hired employees over the last 5, 10, 15 and 20 years;
5	3. The current budget and the projected budget;
6	4. The growth of the budget over the last 5, 10, 15 and 20 years;
7	5. The agency's jurisdiction, roles and responsibilities;
8 9	6. The scope of current projects, completed projects and incomplete projects over the last 5, 10, 15 and 20 years; and
10 11	7. The percentage of the total of the most current state biennial budget that the agency's current budget represents.
12 13 14	Sec. 2. Report. Resolved: That the State Auditor shall submit the report under section 1 to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs no later than November 4, 2026.
