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Amend the amendment by inserting after Part TT the following:

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PART UU

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Sec. UU-1. 36 MRSA §1760, sub-§116 is enacted to read:

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116. Gold and silver coins and bullion. Beginning January 1, 2026, sales of gold  
and silver coins and bullion.

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Amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or  
section number to read consecutively.

### Fiscal Detail and Notes
