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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 399, L.D. 631, "An Act to Allow a Home Distiller to Distill and Share Homemade Spirituous Liquor"

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Amend the bill in section 1 in §1358 in subsection 2 in the 3rd line (page 1, line 17 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "consumption," and inserting the following: 'consumption or'

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Amend the bill in section 1 in §1358 in subsection 2 in the last 2 lines (page 1, lines 18 and 19 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "or shipping the product to the owner's family members and friends"

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Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

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SUMMARY

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This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, removes the provision in the bill allowing distilled spirits to be shipped to the home distillery owner's family members and friends.
