15 16	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and		
17 18 19	Whereas, veterans have made significant sacrifices to protect our country and ensure our freedom, and many of those veterans in Maine may face challenges transitioning back to civilian life; and		
20 21 22 23	Whereas, the Legislature remains committed to supporting efforts that assist military service members and their families as they separate from military service and transition back to civilian life by helping them find stable employment, access health care and housing and find their place in society; and

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Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and inserting the following:

'Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §13056-K is enacted to read:

§13056-K. Active Duty Military Transition to Civilian Life Fund and Program

- 1. Fund established; purpose. The Active Duty Military Transition to Civilian Life Fund, referred to in this section as "the fund," is established within the department as an Other Special Revenue Funds account for the purpose of receiving funds for the program.
- 2. Program established; purpose. The Active Duty Military Transition to Civilian Life Program, referred to in this section as "the program," is established within the department to support organizations in the State conducting outreach and providing support services to active duty military members and their families who are transitioning to civilian life.
- 3. Fund sources; administration. The fund consists of money appropriated or allocated to the fund or received from public or private sources. Through agreements or cooperative arrangements, the department may receive, administer and disburse any funds or contributions from a state or federal agency, person, firm or corporation, either independently or in conjunction with state funds appropriated or allocated to the fund for the purposes of this section.
- 4. Funds held separate; interest credited; nonlapsing. The funds in the fund must be held separate and apart from all other money, funds and accounts. Interest earned by the fund must be credited to the fund. Any unexpended balances remaining in the fund at the end of any fiscal year do not lapse and must be carried forward to the next fiscal year.

SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill and changes the title. The amendment:

- 1. Provides an ongoing annual transfer of \$200,000 from the Medical Use of Cannabis Fund to the Active Duty Military Transition to Civilian Life Fund established within the Department of Economic and Community Development to support organizations in the State that conduct outreach and provide support services to active duty military members and their families who are transitioning to civilian life;
- 2. Creates the Survivors of Military Sexual Trauma Program within the Department of Health and Human Services to assist organizations in the State that provide housing and support services for unhoused veterans and their children and for survivors of military sexual trauma;
- 3. Provides an ongoing annual transfer of \$285,000 from the Medical Use of Cannabis Fund to the Survivors of Military Sexual Trauma Fund established within the Department of Health and Human Services to support organizations in the State that provide housing and support services for unhoused veterans and their children and for survivors of military sexual trauma;

Fiscal Detail and Notes

The bill includes ongoing Other Special Revenue Funds allocations of \$285,000 per year beginning in fiscal year 2025-26 to the Department of Health and Human Services to support organizations in the State providing housing and support services for unhoused veterans, their children and survivors of military sexual trauma. The funding is provided by a transfer of the same amount from the Medical Use of Cannabis Fund (MUCF).

It also includes ongoing Other Special Revenue Funds allocations of \$200,000 per year beginning in fiscal year 2025-26 to the Department of Economic and Community Development to support organizations in the State conducting outreach and providing support services to active duty military members and their families who are transitioning to civilian life. Funding for this program is also provided through a corresponding transfer from the MUCF.

The Office of Cannabis Policy has noted that declining revenues into the MUCF, combined with previously authorized transfers out of it, have reduced the fund balance and increased the risk that available resources will be insufficient to meet existing statutory obligations. The additional obligations and transfers proposed in this bill would increase that risk. If fund resources become insufficient, the Office may need to seek additional funding sources to ensure it can continue to meet its statutory obligations.
