An Act to Ban the Sale, Use and Possession of Single-use Electronic Cigarettes and to Review Extended Producer Responsibility Options for All Batteries

#### 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §1560-C is enacted to read:

### §1560-C. Single-use electronic nicotine delivery device

- 1. **Definitions.** As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
  - A. "Electronic nicotine delivery device" has the same meaning as in section 1560-B, subsection 1, paragraph B.
  - B. "Single-use electronic nicotine delivery device" means an electronic nicotine delivery device that is designed for one-time use and is not rechargeable.
- **2. Prohibition on sale.** A person may not sell or offer to sell a single-use electronic nicotine delivery device.
- **3. Prohibition on use or possession.** A person may not use or possess a single-use electronic nicotine delivery device.
  - **4. Penalties.** A person that violates this section:
  - A. Commits a civil violation for which a fine of \$500 may be adjudged;
  - B. After having previously violated this section, commits a civil violation for which a fine of \$1,000 may be adjudged; and
  - C. After having previously violated this section more than once, commits a civil violation for which a fine of \$5,000 may be adjudged.
- **Sec. 2.** Department of Environmental Protection to convene stakeholder group. The Department of Environmental Protection shall convene a stakeholder group of interested parties to review the feasibility and viability of establishing an extended producer responsibility approach to all batteries not currently covered by an extended producer responsibility requirement, including, but not limited to, batteries used in electronic cigarettes, electronic cigars, electronic pipes, electronic hookahs and so-called vape pens. By December 3, 2025, the department shall submit a report related to the review to the Joint Standing Committee on Environment and Natural Resources, which may submit legislation related to the report to the Second Regular Session of the 132nd Legislature.

30 SUMMARY

This bill prohibits the sale, use and possession of single-use electronic nicotine delivery devices, which include electronic cigarettes, electronic cigars, electronic pipes, electronic hookahs and so-called vape pens. The bill establishes penalties for such sale, use and possession that are similar to the penalties for the sale of nicotine liquid containers that are not child resistant. The bill also directs the Department of Environmental Protection to convene a stakeholder group of interested parties to review the feasibility and viability of establishing an extended producer responsibility approach to all batteries not currently covered by an extended producer responsibility requirement, including, but not limited to, batteries used in electronic cigarettes, electronic cigars, electronic pipes, electronic hookahs and so-called vape pens.
