6 Initiative: Provides ongoing funds to the Maine Multicultural Center in Bangor for one or  
7 more positions to establish a comprehensive program for foreign-trained workers through  
8 the Maine Multicultural Center. The positions will develop and coordinate the  
9 comprehensive program, which must be designed to serve foreign-trained workers with an  
10 emphasis on foreign-trained professionals and seek private funds to support the center's  
11 programs and operations.
