1 Sec. 1. Board of Licensure in Medicine and Board of Osteopathic 2 Licensure study. Resolved: That the Board of Licensure in Medicine and Board of 3 Osteopathic Licensure shall conduct a study regarding the feasibility of combining into a 4 single board that licenses and regulates physicians and physician assistants. In conducting 5 the study, the boards shall ensure that the primary purpose of protecting the public is the 6 paramount consideration in the formation of a single board.

Sec. 2. Report. Resolved: That, by December 31, 2025, the Board of Licensure in
Medicine and Board of Osteopathic Licensure shall submit a report based on the study
conducted in section 1 to the Joint Standing Committee on Health Coverage, Insurance and
Financial Services. The committee is authorized to submit legislation related to the report
to the Second Regular Session of the 132nd Legislature.

This resolve directs the Board of Licensure in Medicine and Board of Osteopathic Licensure to conduct a study regarding the feasibility of combining into a single board that licenses and regulates physicians and physician assistants. The boards are required to submit a report based on the evaluation by December 31, 2025 to the Joint Standing Committee on Health Coverage, Insurance and Financial Services, which may submit legislation related to the report to the Second Regular Session of the 132nd Legislature.
