Fiscal Detail and Notes

The bill includes a one-time Other Special Revenue Funds allocation of \$300,000 in fiscal year 2025-26 and fiscal year 2026-27 to the Department of the Attorney General to contract with a designated nonprofit, independent health insurance consumer assistance entity to continue to operate the Health Insurance Consumer Assistance Program, as established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 24-A, section 4326.

The bill requires that on November 1, 2025 and on June 30, 2026, the State Controller shall transfer \$300,000 from available balances in the Bureau of Insurance Other Special Revenue Funds account within the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation to the Department of the Attorney General.

Any additional costs to the Department of the Attorney General associated with receiving the report from the consumer assistance program and preparing a report for the Legislature are expected to be minor and can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
