11 12 13	<u>A parent or guardian of a minor who believes that the minor has been permitted to</u> <u>become an account holder of a social media company in violation of this chapter may file</u> <u>a complaint against the social media company with the Office of the Attorney General.</u>
14	<u>§1500-EE. Enforcement; penalties</u>
15	The Attorney General shall enforce the provisions of this chapter. A social media
16 17	company that violates a provision of this chapter is subject to the following civil penalties recoverable by the Attorney General in a civil action.
18 19	<b>1.</b> No prior violations; penalty. A social media company that has no previous violations of this chapter may be fined an amount not to exceed \$10,000 per violation.
20 21	<b>2. Prior violation; penalty.</b> A social media company that is found to have a previous violation of this chapter may be fined an amount not to exceed \$25,000 per violation.

23 24 25 26	The Office of the Attorney General shall adopt rules to implement this chapter. Rules must include, but are not limited to, procedures for verifying account holder age and parental consent. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.
27	Sec. 2. Effective date. This Act takes effect January 1, 2026.
28	SUMMARY
29 30 31 32 33 34 35 36	This bill requires social media companies to prohibit individuals under 14 years of age from becoming or remaining an account holder. The bill requires social media companies to verify the age of an individual who attempts to become an account holder and requires social media companies to obtain and verify parental consent of social media account holders who are 14 or 15 years of age. The bill requires the Attorney General to enforce these provisions and stipulates the penalties recoverable by the Attorney General. The bill also directs the Office of the Attorney General to adopt rules to implement the age verification and parental consent processes.
