An Act to Establish a Senior Retiree Lobster License

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- **Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6421, sub-§2,** as amended by PL 1995, c. 568, §1, is further amended to read:
- **2.** Licensed activity. The holder of a Class I, Class II, class III, apprentice, senior retiree or student lobster and crab fishing license may fish for, take, possess, ship or transport within the State lobsters or crabs and sell lobsters or crabs the license holder has taken. The license does not authorize the license holder to remove lobster meat from the shell or to take, possess, transport or ship lobster parts or meat. The holder of a Class II or Class III license is liable for the licensed activities under this subsection of all unlicensed crew members assisting that licensee.

Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §6421, sub-§3-A, ¶G is enacted to read:

- G. A senior retiree lobster and crab fishing license authorizes the license holder to engage in the licensed activities under subsection 2. A person issued a senior retiree lobster and crab fishing license may not submerge at any one time more than 100 lobster traps in the coastal waters of the State. A person issued a senior retiree lobster and crab fishing license may not set traps before May 1st and must remove all traps by December 1st.
- **Sec. 3. 12 MRSA §6421, sub-§5-F** is enacted to read:
- 5-F. Senior retiree lobster and crab fishing license eligibility. A senior retiree lobster and crab fishing license may be issued only to a person who, at the time of application, is 65 years of age or older, has been a resident of the State for a minimum of 10 years and previously held a commercial lobster and crab fishing license for 3 or more consecutive years.
- Sec. 4. 12 MRSA §6421, sub-§7-B, \P Q, as amended by PL 2019, c. 575, §1, is further amended to read:
 - Q. For a noncommercial lobster and crab fishing license, \$60, except as provided in subsection 7-D; and
- **Sec. 5. 12 MRSA §6421, sub-§7-B, ¶R,** as enacted by PL 2017, c. 284, Pt. EEEEE, §3, is amended to read:
 - R. For a nonresident lobster and crab landing permit, \$590.25-; and
 - **Sec. 6. 12 MRSA §6421, sub-§7-B, ¶S** is enacted to read:
- 32 S. For a senior retiree lobster and crab fishing license, \$60.
- **Sec. 7. 12 MRSA §6446, sub-§1-A,** as amended by PL 2015, c. 68, §5, is further amended to read:
 - 1-A. Declared lobster zone; authorized zones. On an application for a Class I, Class II, Class III, senior retiree, student or noncommercial lobster and crab fishing license or a nonresident lobster and crab landing permit, a person shall declare the lobster management zone in which that person proposes to fish a majority of that person's lobster traps and shall list all other zones in which that person proposes to fish any of that person's lobster traps. A Class I, Class II, Class III, senior retiree, student or noncommercial lobster and crab fishing license or a nonresident lobster and crab landing permit must identify the declared

lobster zone in which the person is authorized to fish a majority of that person's lobster traps and must identify all other zones in which a person is authorized to fish that person's traps. A person may not place any lobster traps in a zone that is not identified on that person's license. For the purposes of this subsection, the majority of a person's lobster traps must be determined from the number of trap tags issued to that person.

6 SUMMARY

This bill creates a senior retiree lobster and crab fishing license, establishes eligibility requirements for the license, sets regulations about trap count and placement and fishing dates for license holders and sets a license fee at \$60.
