#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

### Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §1825-B, sub-§15 is enacted to read:

15. Records. The Director of the Bureau of General Services shall preserve and make available on a publicly accessible website all records and documents regarding the competitive bidding process, including a notice of intent to waive competitive bidding under subsection 2 and all underlying supporting documents and all requests for proposals and all underlying supporting documents, including responses, accepted responses and any related financial agreements, and may not delete or destroy any records, correspondence or financial agreements related to the procurement of goods or services except as required by law.

**Sec. 2. Record recovery.** The Department of Administrative and Financial Services shall to the extent possible recover and publish on a publicly accessible website all past notices of intent to waive the competitive bidding process and all underlying supporting documents.

15 SUMMARY

This bill requires the Director of the Bureau of General Services within the Department of Administrative and Financial Services to preserve and make available on a publicly accessible website all records and documents related to the competitive bidding process, including notices of intent to waive competitive bidding. This bill also directs the department to recover and publish past notices of intent to waive competitive bidding.
