Sec. 1. Department of Environmental Protection to submit report on chemical and metal levels. Resolved: That, by December 3, 2025, the Department of Environmental Protection shall submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Environment and Natural Resources regarding available information on the levels of chemicals and metals, both airborne and in soil, in the State, including information on any periodic sampling performed by the department.

Sec. 2. Department of Environmental Protection to submit report on soil testing on solar panel farm sites. Resolved: That, by December 3, 2025, the Department of Environmental Protection shall submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Environment and Natural Resources regarding soil testing done by the department on solar panel farm sites in the State, including testing done before installation, testing done after installation and any ongoing testing, and any results of that testing.

This resolve directs the Department of Environmental Protection to submit 2 reports to the Joint Standing Committee on Environment and Natural Resources. The first report must include available information on the levels of chemicals and metals, both airborne and in soil, in the State, including information on any periodic sampling performed by the department. The 2nd report must include information regarding soil testing done by the department on solar panel farm sites in the State, including testing done before installation, testing done after installation and any ongoing testing, and any results of that testing.
