Sec. 1. Rules relating to electric vehicle rebates. Resolved: That the Efficiency Maine Trust shall amend its rules and modify procedures as necessary to provide that 1/2 of all electric vehicle rebates distributed annually are distributed to low-income and moderate-income residents of this State.

Sec. 2. Rules relating to energy efficiency programs. Resolved: That the Efficiency Maine Trust shall amend its rules and modify procedures as necessary to provide that 1/2 of all funding distributed annually through residential incentives for homeowners investing in energy efficiency and renewable energy is distributed to low-income and moderate-income residents of this State, including, but not limited to, funding for heat pumps and appliances.

11 SUMMARY

This resolve directs the Efficiency Maine Trust to amend its rules relating to electric vehicle rebates and residential incentives for homeowners investing in energy efficiency and renewable energy to provide that 1/2 of the funds distributed annually through those programs are distributed to low-income and moderate-income residents of this State.
