Sec. 1. Swan Island public transportation plan. Resolved: That the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall develop a plan to ensure that accessible, regularly scheduled public transportation is available to Swan Island in Perkins Township in Sagadahoc County.

Sec. 2. Report. Resolved: That, no later than December 3, 2025, the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall report on its plan under section 1, including any suggested legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. The joint standing committee may report out a bill based on the subject matter of the report to the Second Regular Session of the 132nd Legislature.

10 SUMMARY

This resolve directs the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to develop a plan to ensure that accessible, regularly scheduled public transportation is available to Swan Island in Perkins Township in Sagadahoc County. It also requires the department to report on its plan, including any suggested legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, which is authorized to report out a bill to the Second Regular Session of the 132nd Legislature.
