COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 649, L.D. 1002, "An Act to Protect Children's Identification by Requiring Public Schools to Use the Name and Gender Specified on a Child's Birth Certificate"

Amend the bill in section 1 in §14 in the indented paragraph in the last 2 lines (page 1, lines 8 and 9 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "or documentation of a legal change of name or gender is provided to the school"

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

This amendment strikes the provision of the bill that allows a parent to provide documentation of a legal change of a minor student's name or gender to a school in order to direct the school to use that name or gender for the student.
