COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 442, L.D. 1024, "An Act to Expand the List of Crimes That Do Not Qualify for Immunity Under Maine's Good Samaritan Laws Concerning Drug-related Medical Assistance"

Amend the bill in section 3 in subparagraph (24) in the last line (page 1, line 15 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "393;" and inserting the following: "393."

Amend the bill by striking out all of sections 4 and 5.

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

**SUMMARY**

This amendment, which is a minority report of the committee, removes from the bill unlawful trafficking in and unlawful furnishing of scheduled drugs as excluded crimes under Maine's Good Samaritan laws.
