**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

**Whereas**, the safety and well-being of children is paramount; and

**Whereas**, this legislation provides funding to strengthen the capacity of the Maine Child Abuse Prevention Councils to provide essential child abuse prevention services and must take effect before the expiration of the 90-day period to ensure the funding is available as soon as possible; and

**Whereas**, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

**Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

**Sec. 1. Appropriations and allocations.** The following appropriations and allocations are made.

**HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES, DEPARTMENT OF**

**Office of Child and Family Services - Central 0307**

Initiative: Provides funding to the Office of Child and Family Services to strengthen the capacity of the Maine Child Abuse Prevention Councils to provide universal community support for families and essential child abuse prevention services statewide.

**Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved.
