Resolved: That the Department of 15 16 Education shall, within existing resources, review the use of the abbreviated school day 17 provisions described in department rule 05-071 C.M.R. Chapter 101: Maine Unified 18 Special Education Regulation Birth to Age Twenty-Two in schools in the State. The 19 Department of Education may consult with the Maine Education Policy Research Institute 20 to complete the review and requirements of the report described in section 2. 21 Sec. 2. Report. Resolved: That the Department of Education shall submit a report 22 no later than February 1, 2026 to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural 23 Affairs on the findings of the review described in section 1. The report must include data 24 regarding the frequency and duration of abbreviated school day placements and input from 25 stakeholders, including, but not limited to, school personnel and parents. The report must 26 also include information about the impacts that abbreviated school day placements may 27 have on school funding and on student outcomes. The Joint Standing Committee on 28 Education and Cultural Affairs may report out a bill based on the report to the Second 29 Regular Session of the 132nd Legislature.' 30 Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section 31 number to read consecutively. 32 SUMMARY 33 This amendment replaces the bill with a resolve. The amendment directs the 34 Department of Education to review the use of abbreviated school day rule provisions in

schools in the State and requires the department to submit a report on the findings of that review to the Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs. The report must include data on the use of abbreviated school day placements, stakeholder input and information on the impacts abbreviated school day placements may have on school funding and student outcomes. The Joint Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs may report out a bill based on the report to the Second Regular Session of the 132nd Legislature.

However, whether or not the department can accomplish this work without impacting other programs and services can not be determined at this time.
