17 18 19 20 21 22	This amendment is the majority report of the committee. The amendment removes the provision of the bill that requires municipalities, when filling an open position for a firefighter, to give priority consideration to civilian federal firefighters who have been displaced due to a reduction in force at or closure of a federal military installation. It retains the provision of the bill that requires the Department of Labor to establish and maintain a database of displaced civilian federal firefighters in Maine.
