An Act to Provide That Spouses and Children of Corrections Officers Who Die in the Line of Duty Receive a Pension

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §1511 is enacted to read:

### §1511. Pension for spouses or children

If a corrections officer dies as a result of injury received in the line of duty, the spouse or, if none, the minor child or children of the corrections officer must receive a pension equal to 1/2 of the pay of the corrections officer at the time of death, but in no case may the pension be less than \$1,000 annually. The pension must be paid to the spouse until the spouse dies or remarries or, if there is no spouse, to a child or children until the child or children die or attain 18 years of age. For the purposes of this section, "corrections officer" means a person who is responsible for the custody or direct supervision of a person confined in a county jail pursuant to an order of a court or as a result of an arrest and who possesses a valid certificate issued by the Board of Trustees of the Maine Criminal Justice Academy pursuant to Title 25, section 2803-A.

14 SUMMARY

Similar to the provision of law requiring dependents of sheriffs and deputies who die in the line of duty to receive pensions, this bill requires that spouses or children of corrections officers who die as a result of injury received in the line of duty must receive pensions equal to 1/2 of the pay of the corrections officer, but not less than \$1,000 annually.
