An Act to Amend the Law Banning Single-use Carry-out Bags

2	Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §1611, sub-§1, ¶A-1 is enacted to read:

"Carry-out bag" means a bag provided to a customer by a retail establishment for transporting merchandise purchased by the customer away from the retail establishment or for packaging, protecting or otherwise containing merchandise within the retail establishment. "Carry-out bag" includes a single-use carry-out bag, a recycled paper carry-out bag, a reusable fabric carry-out bag and a reusable plastic carry-out bag.

A local government may not adopt an ordinance regulating single-use carry-out bags at retail establishments, and, beginning January 15, 2021, any ordinance or regulation that violates this subsection is void and has no force or effect.
25	Sec. 13. Effective date. This Act takes effect January 1, 2026.
26	SUMMARY
27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34 35	This bill amends the law banning the use of single-use plastic carry-out bags at retail establishments to clarify the scope of that law by incorporating new definitions for "recycled paper carry-out bag," "reusable fabric carry-out bag" and "reusable plastic carry- out bag." It also amends related definitions and makes other associated technical changes, including amending the definition of "point of sale" to provide that the law's prohibitions and other provisions apply to bags provided to a customer at self-service check-out kiosks, at in-store or curbside pickup locations and at any other location, including a customer's home, at which purchased merchandise is delivered or otherwise transferred to the customer.
36 37 38	The bill also increases from 5 cents to 10 cents the fee that a retail establishment must charge for each recycled paper carry-out bag or reusable plastic carry-out bag used to bag products at the point of sale.
39 40	These changes to the law banning the use of single-use plastic carry-out bags at retail establishments are effective January 1, 2026.
