#### State Police 0291

Initiative: Provides funding for one State Police Lieutenant position, one State Police Sergeant position, 3 State Police Detective positions, 2 Management Analyst I positions, technology costs and related costs to develop rules related to attaching serial numbers on privately manufactured firearms within United States Department of Justice, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives guidelines, consulting with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives and performing training on the rules.

Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

#### **SUMMARY**

This amendment removes from the bill the Class C crime of knowingly possessing an undetectable firearm in a courthouse, on school property, in a voting place or in a place where municipal, county or state business is conducted. The amendment clarifies that the culpable state of mind for the prohibitions related to undetectable firearms is "intentionally or knowingly" and that possession of one or more undetectable firearms constitutes a single violation. The amendment adds an exception to the prohibition for possession of an undetectable firearm that is a curio or relic. The amendment changes the effective date from October 1, 2026 to January 1, 2027 for the penalties related to a violation of possessing, importing, transferring or offering to transfer or purchase a firearm without a serial number. The amendment reduces the penalty for failing to make a record of an imprinting to a fine of \$250 for a first offense, a fine of \$500 for a 2nd offense and a Class E crime for a 3rd or subsequent offense. The amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section.

#### **Correctional and Judicial Impact Statements**

The bill creates the Class C crime of manufacturing, importing or offering for sale an undetectable firearm. It also creates a Class C crime for a second or subsequent offense of possessing, importing, transferring or offering to purchase a firearm without a serial number. The current average cost of incarcerating one individual for a single year is \$55,203. It is not known how many individuals may be incarcerated who otherwise would not be. No additional funding has been included at this time.

The additional workload associated with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system does not require additional funding at this time. The collection of additional fines will increase General Fund or other dedicated revenue by minor amounts.

#### Fiscal Detail and Notes

The bill includes General Fund appropriations to the Department of Public Safety of \$616,173 in fiscal year 2025-26 and \$623,570 in fiscal year 2026-27 and Highway Fund allocations of \$331,785 in fiscal year 2025-26 and \$335,768 in fiscal year 2026-27 for one State Police Lieutenant position, one State Police Sergeant position, 3 State Police Detective positions, 2 Management Analyst I positions, technology costs and related costs to develop rules related to attaching serial numbers on privately manufactured firearms within the ATF guidelines, consulting with the ATF and performing training on the rules.
