2	Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §2157 is enacted to read:
3	§2157. Sheltering or aiding missing child
4 5 6 7 8 9	 Duty to inform law enforcement officer. If a person knowingly shelters or aids in obtaining shelter for a missing child for more than 24 hours without the consent of the missing child's parent, guardian or legal custodian, the person shall inform a law enforcement officer as to the missing child's location and condition if the law enforcement officer contacts that person as part of the investigation of the missing child. Violation. A person who violates subsection 1 is subject to a civil penalty not to exceed \$250.
11	SUMMARY
12 13 14 15 16	This bill requires that if a person knowingly shelters or aids in obtaining shelter for a missing child for more than 24 hours without the consent of the missing child's parent, guardian or legal custodian, the person must provide information regarding the missing child's location and condition to a law enforcement officer who has contacted that person. A person who violates this provision is subject to a civil penalty not to exceed \$250.
