3. Mental health referrals. The number of mental health referrals made for individuals assessed as presenting a likelihood of foreseeable harm pursuant to Title 34-B, section 3862-A, including the number of individuals receiving treatment or services pursuant to those referrals.

#### SUMMARY

22 This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, replaces the bill and 23 changes the title. The amendment requires that the annual report on firearm fatalities and hospitalizations, provided by the Director of the Maine Center for Disease Control and 24 25 Prevention within the Department of Health and Human Services, include the number of 26 mental health referrals made for individuals assessed as presenting a likelihood of 27 foreseeable harm and the number of individuals receiving treatment or services pursuant to 28 those referrals. The amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section.

#### **Fiscal Detail and Notes**

The bill includes a one-time General Fund appropriation to the Department of Health and Human Services of \$1,875,219 in fiscal year 2025-26 to develop technology systems infrastructure for data collection and reporting of referrals to mental health treatment or services made by medical practitioners for individuals in protective custody who are found to present a likelihood of foreseeable harm based on the assessment of the medical practitioner.

Any additional costs to the Department of Public Safety Office and the Office of the Attorney General to assist with data collection are expected to be minor and can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
