COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 491, L.D. 1202, "An Act to Establish the African American Studies Advisory Council and Provide Funding to Support African American Studies"

Amend the bill in section 2 in §14 in the first indented paragraph in the 2nd and 3rd lines (page 1, lines 9 and 10 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "serve as a resource to educators, schools and the department to ensure" and inserting the following: 'monitor and measure'

Amend the bill in section 2 in §14 by striking out all of subsection 5 (page 2, lines 1 to 19 in L.D.) and inserting the following:

'5. Curricula implementation. The advisory council shall use data gathered pursuant to the representative statewide sampling conducted by the department under subsection 7 of African American studies curricula in school administrative units to establish a baseline measure of the implementation of African American studies in school administrative units.'

Amend the bill by striking out all of sections 5 and 6 and inserting the following:

'Sec. 5. Teacher certification. The State Board of Education shall, no later than July 1, 2026, evaluate whether the adoption of rules to require the completion of an African American studies component in the qualifications for certifying teachers in accordance with the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, sections 13012-A and 13013 is necessary. The State Board of Education may adopt rules if the State Board of Education determines it necessary.

Sec. 6. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and allocations are made.

SUMMARY

This amendment limits the duties of the African American Studies Advisory Council to establishing a baseline measure of the implementation of African American studies in school administrative units using data collected by the Department of Education. The amendment also strikes the provision related to the convening of a stakeholder group to study an African American studies component to teacher certification requirements and instead allows the State Board of Education to adopt rules to require such a component if the State Board of Education determines that such rules are necessary.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill includes ongoing General Fund appropriations totaling \$165,000 per year beginning in fiscal year 2025-26 to the Department of Education to support the work of the African American Studies Advisory Council including the costs for professional development as well as conducting representative statewide sampling of African American studies curricula in school administrative units.

The bill includes ongoing General Fund appropriations of \$2,800 per year beginning in fiscal year 2025-26 to the Legislature for the expenses of Legislators serving on the Council. The bill also includes ongoing Other Special Revenue Funds allocations of \$500 per year beginning in fiscal year 2025-26 to authorize the expenditure of funds in the event monies are received from public or private sources.

Additional costs to the University of Maine System associated with representatives serving on the advisory council can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
