The bill also provides that the amounts of the grants must be based on a school administrative unit's need for clinicians and in the amount of \$20,000 per clinician prior to July 1, 2027 and \$25,000 per clinician beginning July 1, 2027. The bill provides funding for the grants for fiscal years 2025-26 and 2026-27.
