2	Sec. 1. 25 MRSA c. 415 is enacted to read:
3	CHAPTER 415
4 5	AGREEMENTS WITH FEDERAL IMMIGRATION ENFORCEMENT <u>AUTHORITIES</u>
6	§3891. Agreements with federal immigration enforcement authorities
7 8	1. Definitions. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
9 10	A. "Law enforcement agency" has the same meaning as in Title 5, section 4751, subsection 1.
11 12	B. "Law enforcement officer" has the same meaning as in Title 5, section 4751, subsection 2.
13	2. Prohibition on agreements with federal immigration enforcement authorities.
14 15	A law enforcement agency or law enforcement officer may not enter into a written or oral contract, agreement or arrangement that grants federal immigration enforcement authority
16 17	or powers to the law enforcement agency or law enforcement officer, including an agreement pursuant to 8 United States Code, Section 1357(g).
18	SUMMARY
19 20	This bill prohibits state or local law enforcement agencies or officers from entering into contracts with federal immigration enforcement authorities.
