15 16	Amend the bill in section 1 in paragraph L in the 3rd line (page 1, line 6 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "W drug" the following: ', other than fentanyl powder'
17 18	Amend the bill in section 2 in paragraph L-1 in the first line (page 1, line 9 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "resulting from an overdose"
19 20	Amend the bill in section 2 in paragraph L-1 in the last line (page 1, line 12 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "resulting from the overdose"
21 22	Amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

Correctional and Judicial Impact Statements

The bill creates a Class A crime of aggravated trafficking in a scheduled drug for when serious bodily injury of another person is caused by the use of fentanyl powder. It is unclear how many additional individuals will be convicted of a Class A crime who otherwise would not have been. The current average cost of incarcerating one individual for a single year is \$55,203. No funding has been included in the bill at this time.

The additional workload associated with the minimal number of new felony cases filed in the court system does not require additional funding at this time. The collection of additional fines will increase General Fund or other dedicated revenue by minor amounts.
