16	Amend the resolve by striking out everything after the title and inserting the following:
17	'Sec. 1. Adult treatment courts. Resolved: That the Department of Health and
18	Human Services, Office of Behavioral Health shall establish a working group to develop a
19	plan for expanding the availability of adult drug treatment courts, family treatment courts
20	and veterans treatment courts across the State by ensuring that defendants in each
21 22	prosecutorial district and county have access to these specialty court dockets. As used in this resolve, "adult drug treatment courts" and "family treatment courts" mean specialty
23	court dockets that serve adult criminal defendants whose involvement with the criminal
24	justice system has been caused, at least in part, by a serious substance use disorder and that
25	allow those defendants, upon successful completion of a program involving
26	multidisciplinary supports, services and requirements, to have all or most of their pending
27	criminal charges dismissed. The Office of Behavioral Health shall invite a
28	multidisciplinary group of stakeholders to participate in the working group, including
29	probation and parole officers from the Department of Corrections, as well as
30 31	representatives from the Judicial Department; the Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management; the Department of Health and Human Services, Office of Child
32	and Family Services; the Maine Commission on Public Defense Services; a statewide
33	association of prosecutors; a statewide association of criminal defense attorneys; local law
34	enforcement agencies; organizations that provide pretrial supervision to defendants under
35	pretrial release pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 15, section 1026; and a
36	statewide organization that advocates for reentry services for current and formerly
37	incarcerated individuals in the State. The Department of Health and Human Services,

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 841, L.D. 1266

Office of Behavioral Health shall submit a report of the working group's activities, including any recommendations for expanding the scope and geographic location of treatment courts and suggested legislation developed by the working group, to the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary no later than January 1, 2026. The joint standing committee may report out legislation related to the report to the Second Regular Session of the 132nd Legislature.'

This amendment changes the title of the resolve and directs the Department of Health and Human Services, Office of Behavioral Health, instead of the Attorney General as in the resolve, to convene the working group to propose a plan for expanding the reach of treatment courts. The amendment also directs the office to submit a report of the working group's activities to the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary, including recommendations for expanding the scope and geographic location of treatment courts.
