COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 852, L.D. 1277, "An Act Regarding Controlled Substances Prescription Monitoring Activities"

Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 1 in the last line (page 1, line 6 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "testosterone" and inserting the following: 'anabolic steroids'

Amend the bill in section 2 in the first line (page 1, line 7 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "**testosterone**" and inserting the following: '**anabolic steroids**'

Amend the bill in section 2 in the last line (page 1, line 11 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "testosterone" and inserting the following: 'anabolic steroids'

Amend the bill by inserting after section 2 the following:

'Sec. 3. Appropriations and allocations. The following appropriations and allocations are made.

Initiative: Provides funding for database maintenance to implement the exception of anabolic steroids from the Controlled Substances Prescription Monitoring Program.

SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, removes anabolic steroids from the definition of "controlled substance" in the laws governing controlled substances prescription monitoring, rather than testosterone. The amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section.

Fiscal Detail and Notes

The Department of Health and Human Services will require General Fund appropriations of \$77,000 in fiscal year 2025-26 and \$62,000 in fiscal year 2026-27 for database maintenance to implement the exception of anabolic steroids from the Prescription Monitoring Program.
