An Act to Strengthen Maine's Implied Warranty Laws

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 11 MRSA §2-314-A is enacted to read:
§2-314-A. Implied warranty; seller notification and buyer complaints
(1). The Attorney General shall provide written notice of the implied warranty provisions under sections 2-314 and 2-315 to sellers conducting business in the State primarily through Internet-based sales who remit \$10,000 or more in sales tax to the State.
(2). The Attorney General shall make available to buyers in the State an online complaint form by which a buyer can submit to a seller a complaint regarding goods subject to the implied warranty provisions under sections 2-314 and 2-315.
SUMMARY
This bill requires the Office of the Attorney General to notify online sellers doing business in the State, who remit \$10,000 or more in sales tax, of the implied warranty laws. The bill also requires the Attorney General to make available an online complaint form for residents to use if they believe the seller is not adhering to the implied warranty laws.
