9 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 538, L.D. 1308, "Resolve, Directing the
10 Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to Establish a Working Group to Explore
11 Opportunities to Maintain Public Access of Land"

12 Amend the resolve by striking out the title and substituting the following:

13 'Resolve, Directing the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and the
14 Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to Examine Issues Related to
15 Public Access to Privately Owned Lands'

16 Amend the resolve by striking out everything after the title and inserting the following:

17 'Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not
18 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

19 Whereas, a majority of land in the State is privately owned; and

20 Whereas, the ability of residents to access these lands is in jeopardy as more and more
21 landowners are closing off access to their land; and

22 Whereas, urgent action is needed to ensure this trend is reversed; and

23 Whereas, this legislation must take effect as soon as possible to convene a working
24 group to explore opportunities to increase access and address these issues; and

25 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within
26 the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as
27 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now,
28 therefore, be it

29 **Sec. 1. Working group. Resolved:** That the Department of Inland Fisheries and
30 Wildlife and the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, jointly referred to
31 in this resolve as "the departments," shall convene a working group to examine issues
32 related to public access to privately owned land in the State and opportunities to expand
33 this access.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

1 **Sec. 2. Working group membership. Resolved:** That the working group
2 established under section 1 must be as broadly representative of interested parties and
3 groups as possible, must be geographically representative of the different regions of the
4 State and consists of at least the following 12 members:

- 5 1. A representative of a statewide organization representing commercial forest
6 landowners;
- 7 2. A representative of a statewide organization representing small woodland owners;
- 8 3. A representative of an organization managing recreational access to the North Maine
9 Woods;
- 10 4. A representative of a conservation organization that manages land or conservation
11 easements;
- 12 5. A representative of an agricultural organization;
- 13 6. A representative of a statewide organization representing Maine guides;
- 14 7. A representative of the tourism and outdoor recreation industry focused on hiking,
15 wildlife watching, biking, paddling or other popular outdoor pursuits;
- 16 8. A representative of a statewide association representing hunters and anglers;
- 17 9. A representative of a statewide association representing recreational vehicle users;
- 18 10. A representative from the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry,
19 Bureau of Parks and Lands;
- 20 11. A representative from the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife's landowner
21 relations program; and
- 22 12. A representative from the Department of Economic and Community Development.

23 **Sec. 3. Working group chairs. Resolved:** That the Commissioner of Agriculture,
24 Conservation and Forestry or the commissioner's designee and the Commissioner of Inland
25 Fisheries and Wildlife or the commissioner's designee serve as cochair of the working
26 group under section 1 and shall make appointments to the working group as outlined in
27 section 2. The cochair shall serve as nonvoting members of the working group.

28 **Sec. 4. Working group duties. Resolved:** That the working group under section 1
29 shall:

- 30 1. Solicit and explore strategies to provide private landowners with financial incentives
31 to maintain and expand recreational access to important corridors and destinations;
- 32 2. Solicit input from a broad range of individuals and businesses involved in outdoor
33 and traditional recreational activities, landowners, outdoor recreation and public access
34 policy experts and the general public to understand the history and value of and issues
35 associated with the State's tradition of public access to public and private property;
- 36 3. Develop an assessment of the current and future status of public access to public and
37 private property, with particular attention to current and future outdoor and traditional
38 recreational activities;
- 39 4. Bring forth additional discussion points as agreed upon by the working group;

6. Evaluate enforcement of existing laws and rules on designated state trail systems.

Sec. 6. Report. Resolved: That the departments shall report any findings and recommendations resulting from meetings of the working group under section 1 to the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry and the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife by February 15, 2026. Each of the committees may report out a bill based on the report to the Second Regular Session of the 132nd Legislature.

Amend the resolve by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

The amendment replaces the resolve, changes the title and adds an emergency preamble and emergency clause. It directs the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry to establish a working group that is broadly representative of landowner and land user interests to explore ways to maintain and expand public access to privately owned lands in the State. The departments are directed to report any findings and recommendations of the working group to the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry and the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife by February 15, 2026. Each committee is authorized to report out a bill based on the report to the Second Regular Session of the 132nd Legislature.
