26 27 28	2. Location. Of the certified recovery residences acquired or operated pursuant to subsection 1, one must be located in a municipality with a population of 20,000 or greater and one must be located in a municipality with a population of less than 20,000.

Each certified recovery residence acquired or operated under this section must be staffed by at least 2 peer-to-peer support staff members who are certified in intentional peer support and peer recovery coaching and who are paid at least livable wages, as defined in Title 26, section 1-A. Staffing must be provided at a level that is responsive to the specific population served, number of residents and certification level of the residence.

12 5. Fund established. The Culturally Appropriate and Trauma-informed Recovery 13 Residence Fund is established as a nonlapsing fund within the Maine State Housing Authority to receive funds to support the activities described in this section and may accept 14 15 private donations. The Maine State Housing Authority shall distribute funds through a 16 competitive bid process to grantees for the acquisition or operation of recovery residences that provide culturally appropriate and trauma-informed services to underserved, 17 18 underrepresented or disparately impacted individuals in recovery from substance use 19 disorder. The Maine State Housing Authority shall adopt rules establishing criteria for the 20 competitive bid process and for the distribution of funds to grantees under this subsection.

36 SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the majority report of the committee, replaces the bill and changes the title. The amendment requires the Maine State Housing Authority to conduct a competitive bid process to distribute funds in the newly established Culturally Appropriate and Trauma-informed Recovery Residence Fund. The funds must be used to acquire or operate 2 recovery residences led by individuals educated and trained to provide culturally appropriate and trauma-informed services to underserved, underrepresented or

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disparately impacted individuals in recovery from substance use disorder. One residence must be located in a community with a population of 20,000 or greater and the other residence must be located in a community with a population under 20,000.

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

Fiscal Detail and Notes

This bill includes ongoing Other Special Revenue Funds base allocations of \$500 per year beginning in fiscal year 2025-26 to a newly created Culturally Appropriate and Trauma-informed Recovery Residence Fund within the Maine State Housing Authority to authorize the expenditure of any funds received to support the acquisition and operation of recovery residences that provide culturally appropriate and trauma-informed services to underserved, underrepresented or disparately impacted individuals in recovery from substance use disorder. The Maine State Housing Authority has indicated that it does not have funds available for this purpose.

Any additional costs to the Department of Health and Human Services from the provisions of this bill are expected to be minor and can be absorbed within existing budgeted resources.
