SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 559,
L.D. 1343, "An Act to Protect the Right to Harvest Wildlife"

Amend the amendment by inserting after the title the following:

'Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

'An Act to Protect the Right to Harvest Fish and Wildlife'

Amend the amendment by striking out all of the 2nd instructional paragraph (page 1,
lines 12 to 14 in amendment) and inserting the following:

'Amend the bill in section 2 in subsection 29-A in paragraph B in the first 2 lines (page
1, lines 14 and 15 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "sport, wildlife management or
population control" and inserting the following: 'sustainable use'

Amend the amendment by inserting after the 3rd instructional paragraph and before
section 3 the following:

'Sec. 3. 12 MRSA §10001, sub-§61-A is enacted to read:

61-A. Sustainable use. "Sustainable use" means the use of a resource so that the
resource is not depleted or permanently damaged.'

Amend the amendment by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or
section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

This amendment amends Committee Amendment "A" to change the title of the bill and
to remove references to wildlife management and population control from the definition of
the verb "harvest" enacted by the bill in the inland fisheries and wildlife laws. It adds a
definition of "sustainable use."
